Operation Pollinator Participation Commitments

Working Document – final terms to be signed off after site selection.

Expressions of Interest for participation in the 2023 Operation Pollinator program close at 5pm on Friday 2 June 2023. Syngenta Turf & Landscape ANZ will announce the chosen finalists at the ASTMA Conference in Adelaide.

Site Owner commits to:

Site Owner will be required to commence first herbicide treatment, or other clearing protocol as discussed with the program organiser by the 31st July 2023. And commits to planting during April-September 2024.

Site Owner commits to completing the project, taking a total of approximately three years if the milestones are hit.

Site Owner commits to purchasing and planting the required tube stock, seeds and/or plants for the Operation Pollinator designated area. As a rough guide, a 500m² area will require approx 1,000 plants (2 per m²), at roughly \$2-3 per tube. This is pricing guidance only and may change.

Permission will be given for photography of the site for use in media publications, by Syngenta and/or for marketing purposes. The Site Owner commits to providing regular written and photographic updates of the site across the project period.

Site Owner must seek permission from the Club/Venue/Land-owner for use of the land for Operation Pollinator prior to beginning.

Syngenta commits to:

Engage a consultant (Environmental Golf Solutions) who will provide:

- Assessment and initial plan for site (plant list)
- Initial assessment (in person if needed, photos may suffice in some instances)
- Final assessment (prior to planting teaching how and where to plant, in some instances a planting map may be provided).

Provide information and guidance on the process at all points along the project, including access to technical managers for advice and help where required.

Provide appropriate "Operation Pollinator" signage for the Site.

At the conclusion of the project, provide a case study of the project plus a promotional pack of information for the Site.
